## What is The Hudson Valley Art Association?

The Hudson Valley Art Association (HVAA) was founded in 1928 by artists of the Hudson Valley Region in the Studio of Jasper Cropsey (1823-1900), one of the most celebrated of the American landscape artists.

For many years the Association functioned as a local art society. Later it became regional – drawing exhibitors from the New England States, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, and Pennsylvania – growing in strength and importance until it is now a national non-profit organization.

No forms of distorted paintings are accepted by the Hudson Valley Art Association at their exhibitions as it is the aim of the Association to preserve and encourage the character, knowledge, craftsmanship and respect for natural form, color and design which distinguish fine painting and sculpture.

HVAA holds an annual exhibition of oils, aqua media, pastels, graphics and sculpture in the Exhibition Galleries of invitational associations. The show is open

to non-members as well as members. Awards totaling approximately \$15,000 are given for meritorious works.

All proceeds from entry fees are applied toward the cost of the exhibition. Any deficit is paid from membership dues. Many long hours are spent in preparation for a show that has gained wide recognition for both artists and laymen.

Artist members of the Board of Directors select from non-member exhibitors whose work is outstanding, and an invitation is extended to them for membership. If you enjoy the Hudson Valley Art Association Exhibitions, it would be most heartening to learn of your approval. Of course, contributions to the support of the Association, or its Scholarship Fund, are most welcome.

## **Jurors of Award**

**Daniel E. Greene, N.A.** is one of America's leading figure, portrait and still-life painters and has been internationally acclaimed as one of the world's most accomplished pastelists. His portrait subjects have been leaders of Government, Banking, Education, Industry, Royalty and the Arts, and include First Lady Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt, Author Ayn Rand, Publisher William Randolph Hearst, Ambassador John Loeb Jr., Baroness Betsee Parker, Commentators Bryant Gumbel, Bob Schieffer and Composer Alan Menken. His works hang in more than 700 public and private collections. Mr. Greene has taught at the Art Students League and at The National Academy of Design in New York and has instructed over ten thousand students throughout the USA and Europe. Mr. Greene is the author of two definitive books, Pastel and The Art of Pastel which have been translated into nine languages and he has produced six instructional videos collected by artists world-wide. In 2017, a biography was published about Mr. Greene's work titled "Daniel E. Greene, Studios and Subways, An American Master, His Life and Art." He is the subject of two 2018 Museum Retrospective exhibitions at The Butler Institute of American Art in Youngstown, OH and the Mattatuck Museum in Waterbury, CT.

In 2001, the Portrait Society of America presented Daniel E. Greene with the Medal of Honor for his distinguished body of work. In 1999, he was awarded The Artists Fellowship Benjamin West Clinedinst medal for the achievement of exceptional artistic merit. In 1995, the American Society of Portrait Artists honored Greene with the John Singer Sargent Award for life-long dedication to the achievement of excellence in portraiture. In 1992, the Oil Painters of America Society named him to their Hall of Fame. In 1983 Mr. Greene was inducted into the Pastel Hall of Fame. Numerous articles about his art have appeared in *The Artists Magazine, American Artist Magazine, International Artist Magazine, The World and I, Art News Magazine, Pastel Journal, Plein Air Magazine , New York Magazine, The New York Observer, The New York Times, American Art Collector, Disegnare & Dipingere (Italy) and Artistes Magazine (France).* 

## **Jurors of Award**

**Janet A. Cook** has exhibited widely at galleries and institutions, including the United Nations, NY. in May 2019, Dacia Gallery, NYC is hosting her fourth solo show.

Over the years she has received many awards for excellence, including finalists in the Art Renewal Center and The Portrait Society of America 2017; Two awards at the Portrait Society of America Annual Member Show, a Gold and Silver medal from the Allied Artists of America and The Salmagundi Club; a Master Circle Medal award from The International Association of Pastel Societies, Best in Show from the Catherine Lorillard Wolfe Art Club. Don Gale was one of the founding professors of the Lyme Academy College of Fine Arts in Old Lyme, Connecticut when it was rewarded full accreditation in 1995. He held the position of Chairman of the Sculpture Department until 2010 when he was granted the honorary title of Professor Emeritus. In addition, he taught sculpture and drawing at other institutions and workshops such as: Adjunct Professor at the National College of Art and Design in Dublin, Ireland; Adjunct Professor at the New York Academy of Art; Guest Instructor at the Loveland Academy of Fine Arts, Loveland, CO; Instructor at the Athenaeum School of Fine Arts, La Jolla, CA; and Instructor at the Otis Institute of Parson School of Design, Los Angeles, CA; Founder and Instructor of the Gale Sculpture School, Los Angeles, CA. At the present he is teaching at New Canaan Sculpture Group in New Canaan, CT.
